The concert was attended by a large number of the college faculty and student body, as well as outside friends from Raleigh.

The program was opened by a group of French compositions, possessing the naive grace and charm so peculiar to the French music of the 17th and 18th centuries. The first number in this group was "Suite Du Premier Ton," by Clerambault; and the second number was "Noel Sur Les Flutes," by D'Aquin, a composition so descriptive that it en-

### Christmas Concert Rendered by Choir

### Carols Broadcast Over Radio Station WPTF Last Sunday

Sunday afternoon, December 11, at five o'clock, the Meredith choir presented its annual program of Christmas music in the college auditorium. The choir, under the direction of Prof. Leslie P. Spelman, rendered one of the most beautiful and effective programs ever to be presented at Meredith.

An organ prelude, "Rhapsodie Catalane" by Joseph Bonnet, opened the program, after which the hymn, "O Little Town of Bethlehem," was sung. Following the invocation, the choir rendered its first number, "Break Forth O Beauteous Heavenly Light," a choral from "Christmas Oratorio" by Bach; and this was followed by a solo, the aria from the same oratorio, sung by Miss Ethel Rowland, professor of voice. The hymn, "Silent Night, Holy Night," probably the best loved bit of Christmas music ever written, concluded the first part of the program.

Beginning at 5:30 o'clock, the concert was broadcast through the facilities of station WPTF, Raleigh. The second part of the program was opened with a group of traditional carols from different countries, sung by the choir. The first in this group was a German carol, "Good Christian Men, Rejoice"; and the second was the
