American Journal of International Law and contributor to various such journals.

For the subject of his address at the Southern IRO Conference Professor Eagleton has chosen "Forces Leading to Future International Organization."

Miss Jones is the Carnegie Endowment representative in charge of the International Relations Clubs. and will conduct the meetings. This she is especially qualified to do because of her contact with such clubs throughout the world. Miss Jones has lived in France and Germany and been a frequent visitor in Europe and is a well-known participant in international conferences. She has traveled widely in the Orient visiting Interational Relations Clubs for the Carnegic Endowment.

Miss Jones is a member of the American Political Science Association and of the American Society of International Law, as well as of the Conference of Teachers of International Law and Related Subjects and of its Committee on Adult Education and Public Relations.
