Speaks in Raleigh Nov. 2, 8:30 P.M.

Committee Makes Plans For Parade and Talk

After delivering an address to the State Senate in Statesville, President Harry Truman will speak in Raleigh in the Memorial Auditorium at 8:30, on November 2. Approximately 1,000 seats are to be reserved for Democratic party leaders and certain State and county officials. As the Memorial Auditorium seats 3,700 persons, approxi-mately 2,700 seats will be avail-able to the general public. For those who do not obtain seats, a public address system will be set up so that the President's address can be heard in the surrounding area.

According to schedule, President Truman and his party will arrive by plane at 6:00 p.m. on November 2, at the Raleigh-Durham Airport. There they will be met by a welcoming in an open car to the Memorial
