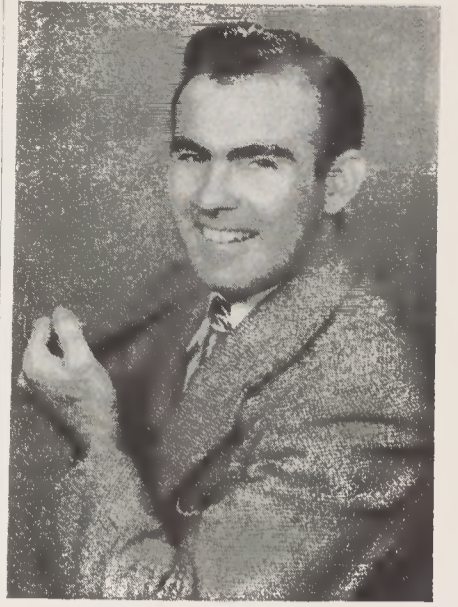
**Louise Hunt Wins Contest**
