### **Remodeling Plans** Are Announced

In accordance with the general program of improving campus facilities, the executive committee of the Board of Trustees has authorized certain remodeling, perhaps to be done during the summer, of the first floor of Johnson Hall. This work will complete the project begun two years ago with the removal of the steps to the library floor and their subsequent replacement with the ground floor front entrance.
