Mrs. Long had just returned from a three week tour of Colombia where she visited her daughter. She traveled in the three different geographic areas of Colombia: the coastland of Cartagena, the interior of Pereira and Manizales, Medellín and the 9,000 ft. high capital of Bogotá. Mrs. Long's talk concerned Peace Corps work as she saw it, as well as her general impressions of this Spanish land.

Her talk was illustrated with slides depicting life of the rural Colombian in contrast with the elegance of city life in Medellín and Bogotá.
