### **Meredith Receives** \$5,000 Gulf Grant

A capital grant of \$5,000 has been received by Meredith College from the Gulf Oil Foundation.

The grant will be applied to the college's \$5 million advancement program, said Dr. Heilman, after J. R. Timmerman, district sales manager of Gulf, presented him the check this week.

The \$5,000 grant to Meredith is part of more than \$3 million that Gulf will distribute this year to students and institutions of higher education for a variety of purposes.

The capital grant phase of the program is an effort to assist institutions in meeting anticipated growth requirements, to replace obsolete buildings and equipment and to expand services.

Institutions eligible for capital grants are those which are privately operated and controlled, and which obtain a major portion of their fisupport from non-tax sources.

Mona Blevins is a humble and ashamed refugee from Europe as the eleventh juror. The twelfth juror, portrayed by Kathy Johnston, is a superficial snob.

These twelve women are responsible for deciding the fate of a 19year-old boy who is accused of stabbing his father to death.

Director for the production will be Miss Solomon. Jane Harris will serve as assistant director. The stage crew work will be done by the members of the Meredith Playhouse.


