

Several guest speakers and other activities are planned for the week. Dr. Carolyn Bennett, publisher and editor of The Network of North Carolina Women, will be the guest speaker for the

A shift of responsibility is underway in the Meredith English Department. After serving for thirteen years as department head, Dr. Norma Rose is stepping down. Dr. Rose, who has been teaching
