THE METROPOLITAN MUSEUM OF ART: Internships for college students — Summer 1982. Special work-study program for college students interested in museum ca-

reers. Participants become acquainted with the museum collections and services through a program that includes orientation meetings, discussions, and field trips conducted by museum staff and other specialists. In addition, each intern works halftime at the Visitor's Center, the facility which provides information to the public, and gives introductory guided tours of the collection to the general public. June 14 to August 23. Each intern will receive an honorarium of \$1200. Applications will be accepted from college students with strong backgrounds in art history who have completed their junior year, or are graduating seniors. An interest in the humanities and museum education will be considered equally important as a candidate's academic qualifica-

tions. The completed application and recommendations must reach the museum by March 12, 1982. A small group of students will be selected for interviews in New York City. Students not available for an interview are rarely accepted into the program. Final notification to all applicants will be mailed by April 30, 1982.
