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Burns Speaks

Norma Burns, architect and president of Workspace, Inc., a design and furniture company for corporations, spoke Tuesday, Oct. 5 in a Delta Mu Delta sponsored meeting.

In a very interesting talk, she spoke about owning a small business and the extensive preparation it takes to finance, research, and prepare facilities before the doors can even be opened. In addition, she discussed her relations with her different partners and suggested that the best partners are those who can specialize in different areas of the business.

Addressing her talk specifically to women, Ms.

Burns pointed out that most women have been taught to want to be liked, a desire she considers a liability in the business world. She advised her audience to, instead, win the respect of others; the objective of a business person is not making friends but establishing cordial working relationships out of which friendships may eventually grow. She also advised would-be professionals to read periodicals in their field and join professional organizations.

Directing her speech to Meredith women, Ms. Burns said she hopes more women will consider going into business for themselves.
