

Judi Board minutes

The Judicial Board met on January 17, 1983. The Board heard two cases concerning plagiarism. Both girls were placed on academic probation for the rest of the year. On January 24, 1983, the Board heard two cases concerning a violation of the freshman curfew, entering a residence hall by unauthorized means, and having a male in the residence hall after closing hours. The first girl was placed on probation for the spring semester 1983 and for the fall semester 1983. This probation excluded her from all extra curricular activities. The second girl who was found not guilty of violating freshman curfew was given a two-week campus.

The Board met again on January 31, 1983. The case

concerned falsification of college records. An upperclassman had signed in using another person's name. She was given a penalty of a one-week campus. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

The Judicial Board met on February 7, 1983 in 105 Joyner. The Board heard a case concerning two violations of the Honor Code—breaking a campus and violating probation. The Honor Code states that anyone violating probation shall be suspended. The Board voted for a penalty of suspension for the duration of the spring semester of 1983. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

Cellist Selma Gokcen will appear in concert with the North Carolina Symphony on Thursday, March 3, at 8:00 p.m. in Raleigh Memorial Auditorium.

The all Tchaikovsky concert will be conducted by North Carolina Symphony Artistic Director Gerhardt Zimmerman. The program will include the Overture from *Hamlet*, Opus 67, the Symphony No. 6 in B Minor ("Pathetique"), and the Variations on a Rococo Theme, featuring Ms. Gokcen as soloist.

One of the nation's most

promising young cellists, Selma Gokcen appears with the North Carolina Symphony as a winner of the 1982 Kathleen and Joseph M. Bryan Young Artist Auditions.

At the age of 28, Ms Gokcen has won a string of national and regional competitions, including the Ima Hogg Young Artist Auditions, the Flagler Matthews Auditions, the North American Young Artist competition, and the Hudson Valley Young Artist Competition. She has appeared in concert with the Aspen Philharmonia, the Basel Symphony Orchestra in Switzerland, the Chicago Civic Orchestra, and the Juilliard Orchestra, and as solo recitalist at the Spoleto Festival in

Charleston, S.C., Phillips Gallery in Washington, D.C., and in Boston, New York and Carolina Arts other major American cities.

In 1975 Ms. Gokcen toured Peru under the auspices of the U.S. State Department.

In addition to solo appearances, Ms. Gokcen has performed chamber music at the Hindemith Festival in Oregon, the Eastern Carolina Arts Festival in Greenville, N.C., the Chamber Music-West Festival in San Francisco, and in New York City.

Selma Gokcen currently resides in Greenville, N.C. She is a member of the music faculty of East Carolina University.

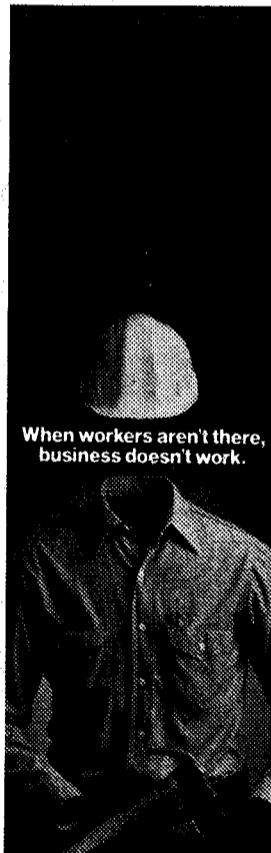
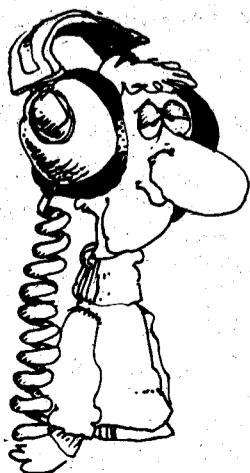
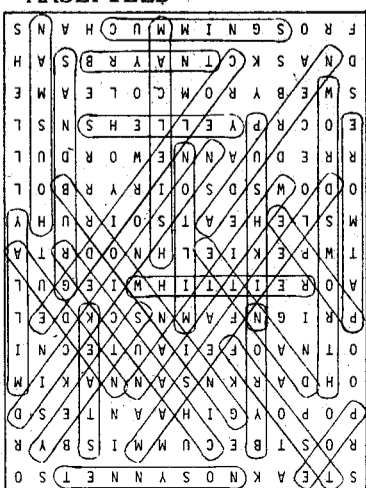
