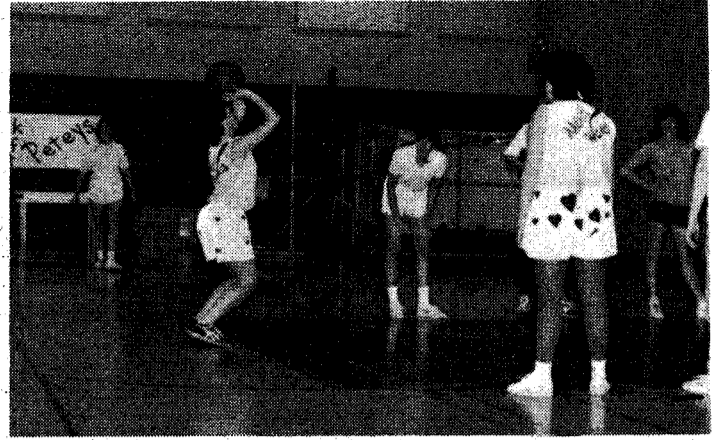
With these wins, they advanced to the semi-finals and continued to be victorious with
