6. Any items found that are in violation of College Policy may be confiscated (i.e. drugs, alcohol, extension cords, etc.). All prescription drugs should be clearly labeled.

7. The Executive Committee operates on the premise that there shall be no alcohol on campus. Quantity is not an issue. Any container intended for the storage of alcohol that is kept as a souvenir should be washed thoroughly before being brought to campus to remove any suspicion of possession of alcohol on campus.

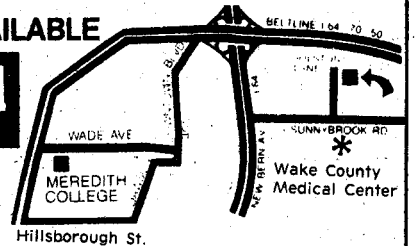
