Dr. Thomas P. Grissom, Jr., visiting Kenan Professor, will be speaking Wednesday, February the 13th at 10 a.m. in worship service for Black Emphasis Week.

Grissom was born in New York and received his Bachelor of Arts from Clark College, GA; Bachelor of Divinity from Gammon Theological Seminary, GA; Master of Divinity from Interdenominational Theological Center, GA; and Doctorate of Divinity from both Houston-

Tillotson College, TX and Gammon Theological Seminary and the Interdenominational Theological Center, GA.

Currently the Senior Minister of Salem United Methodist Church in New York, Dr. Grissom has had several appointments, awards and honors from across the U.S. During his visit at Meredith, Grissom will be giving lectures to several classes. The schedule is posted outside Dr. Sumner's office in Joyner. Grissom is also teaching a one credit hour course entitled "Profile of Black America."
