

The Meredith College tennis team evened their record at 1-1 by losing at the rackets of St. Mary's College. The match was played Tuesday, March 19 on the St. Mary's campus. The only Angel to score a win in singles was Melinda Wrenn, who defeated the number 6 player from St. Mary's 6-2, 4-6, and 6-0. Meredith posted a doubles win when Theresa Duffy and Barbara Bulla wiped out Smith and Burton in three sets, 6-4, 4-6, and 6-0.

In other matches, Theresa was de-

feated by Lynn Burton, 6-2, 6-5 and Barbara lost to Kathryn Finney, 6-4, 6-3. Pam Fisher forced Carter Fauber into three sets but came up short, 2-6, 6-4, and 6-3. Elizabeth Hornthal lost to Julie Brady, 6-4, 6-3, and Laura Cochrane was defeated by Meg Adams, 6-0, 6-2.

Elizabeth and Laura teamed up in doubles but were turned away by Brady and Finney, 6-0, 6-2. Melinda and freshman Sara McMillian were defeated by Adams and Allison Helnick, 6-2, 6-1.

came back to defeat Sally Amon 4-6, 6-2, and 6-3.
