Renowned disc jockey Wolfman Jack led a procession of 50's automobiles and the NCSU Marching Band down Hillsborough Street on Saturday, April 13.

Those visiting the restaurant registered for an authentic 1955 Chevy Bel Air, to be given away April 22. The restaurant's 50's motiff is unique to the McDonald's system and is authentic all the way down to its 1952 Seeburg jukebox, which was fully restored specifically for the restaurant.


We hid the Crook during Easter Break, Don't let the rain wash it away or uncover it though.
