Meredith softball wraps up season

The Meredith College Softball team finished the 1985 season by compiling a record of eight wins and ten losses. The Angels wrapped up the season with a big win over Duke University and with losses to Atlantic Christian College and Mt. Olive College.

On April 2, Meredith hosted ACC in their second meeting of the season. ACC won both games by scores of 9-3 and 9-0. There was more hitting in the first game by both teams as Meredith tallied eight hits and ACC had eleven. But the bats were quieter in the second game. Coach Bross named freshman outfielder Kelly Bagby Offensive Player of the Day and sophomore leftfielder Margaret Gill was named Defensive Player of the Day.

Duke returned to Meredith on April 3 to be dealt their second loss at the hands of the Angels. Meredith won both contests 4-1 and 7-4. The Angels compiled seven hits in the first game, two of which came from the bat of Kelly Bagby. Meredith increased their hits to ten in the

second game. Sophomore Joan Wyatt led with three hits and classmate "Buzz" Mann was close behind with two. Joan was named Offensive Player of the Day while freshman catcher Debra Kirkland took the title of Defensive Player of the Day.

The bats were hot in Mt. Olive when Meredith traveled there April 9. Both teams hit well but Mt. Olive pulled ahead on the doubleheader by winning 19-6 in

the first game and 9-2 in the second. "We played well offensively," said Coach Cindy Bross, "but the four days off for Easter hurt us defensively." Sophomore Beth Kennedy had an outstanding day at the plate by racking two hits in each game. Freshman shortstop Lou Ann Stephenson belted in a homerun. The two shared the honors as Offensive Players of the Day. Freshman second baseman Carla Quinn, who committed no errors in the doubleheader, was named Defensive Player of the Day.
