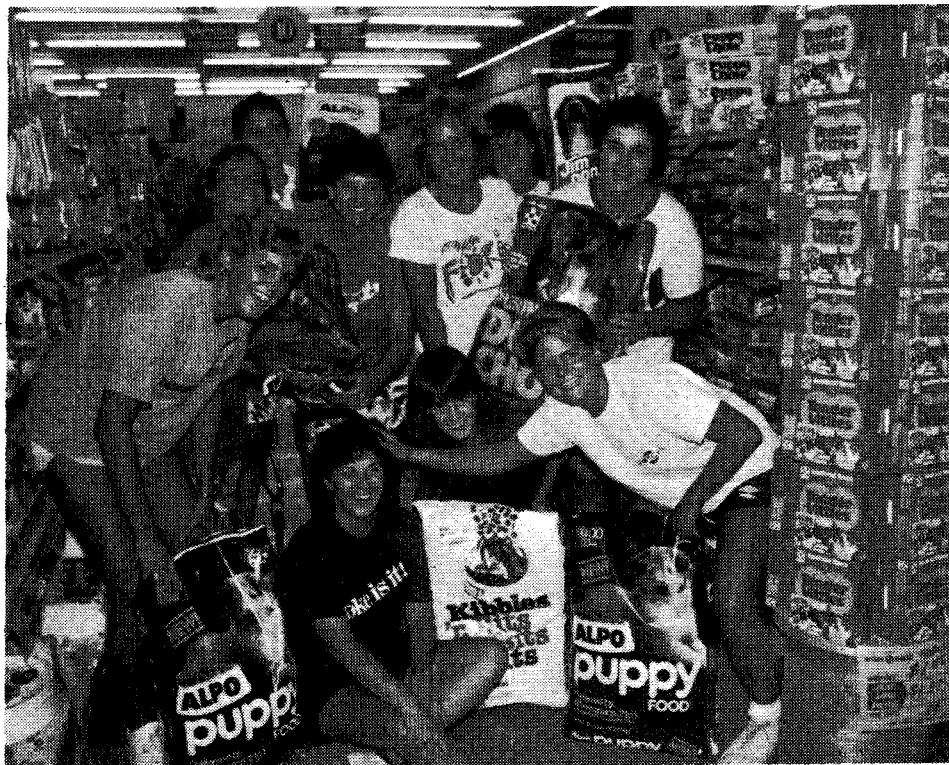
MRA is Ready — Are You?
