Gina Howard, a sophomore, won first place and was awarded a \$200 tuition

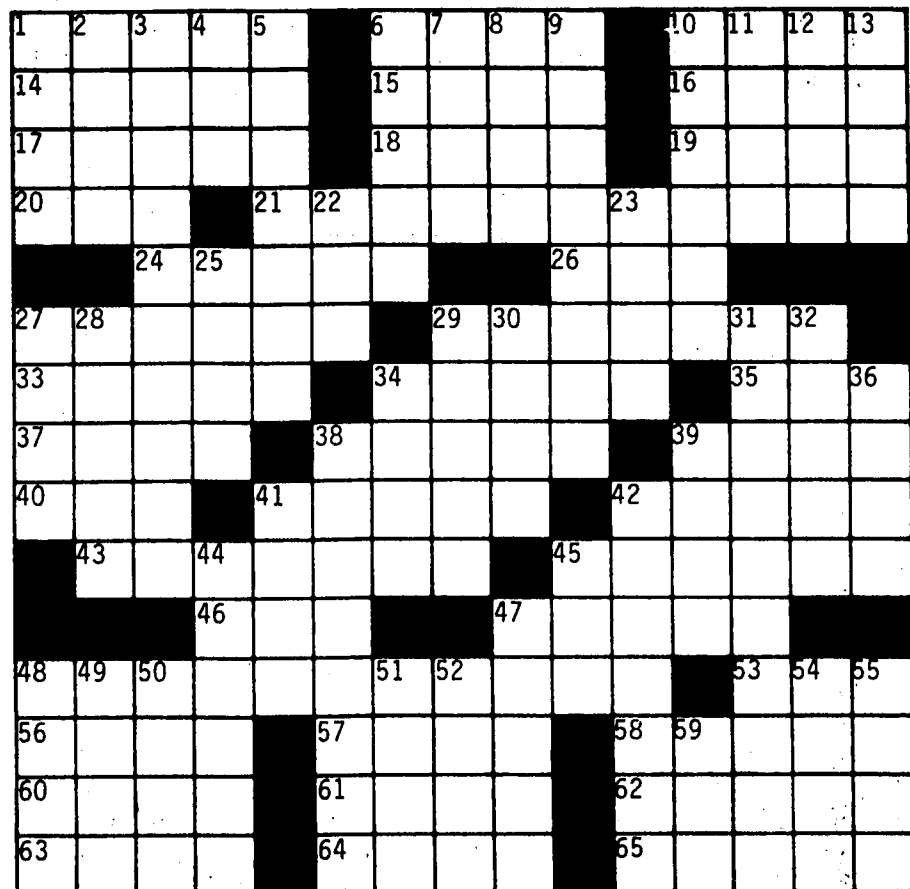
scholarship. Last year, as a freshman, she won a special merit award. Gina's majors are Mathematics/Computer Science and Economics.
