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'Wisdom' Programs Provide Answers

Meredith's Personal Growth and Counseling Center is presenting a series of five lectures to answer questions dealing with women's health issues. The series will be conducted by the Counseling Center and by Susan Schrag, the former Health Education Coordinator at Planned Parenthood of Raleigh. The series begins on Wednesday, March 22 and a different lecture will be presented every Wednesday evening until April 19.

The first lecture is titled "Changes, Women's Health Issues 'Now What's Happening to Me?' "The lecture will involve the physical dilemmas faced by many women today, including pre-menstrual syndrome, toxic shock syndrome and breast tenderness, and how these "maladies" can affect a woman's daily performance and attitude. The lecture will provide advice on how a good diet and exercise can positively affect the reproductive system.

The purpose behind the lectures is to provide information that Meredith feels is essential to the well-being of her students. In an effort to answer questions students may be too embarrassed to ask, students will be given the opportunity to write the questions anonymously and have them answered.

The lectures will be held in the Cate Center Auditorium with the exception of the last lecture on April 19, which will be held in 103 Joyner.
