## Inside CCL

"Okay," you think, "I've seen these new compact discs rapidly replacing the lp albums in music stores, but now you're telling me they're moving into the reference section of the library?"

Yes, they are. Their technical name is CD-ROMS (compact disc-read only memory), and they are making available to researchers vast amounts of information in new and exciting ways.

Last year Carlyle Campbell Library added two CD-ROM databases to its reference resources - ABI/INFORM, an index to over 800 business and management periodicals, and PERIODICALS ABSTRACTS ONDISC, an index to over 300 current general interest periodicals.

The library currently has on loan for a trial period a new CD-ROM database, SOCIOFILE, an index to hundreds of journals in the social sciences. In addition, the CD-ROM database PSYCHLIT, the online version of the printed index Psychological Abstracts, is expected to be in the library soon.

Using a compact disc as the storage medium (instead of print or microformat), a microcomputer allows the researcher to find journal articles on a specific subject or even to combine subjects. You can search by subject descriptors, authors names, company names, keywords, popular phrases and in many other ways. Simple on-screen instructions guide the user through the search process with only a few keystrokes. A tutorial, help windows, and an on-screen "command line" offer additional assistance.
