that these tests were <u>not</u> being done any longer; at the same time she was filming these tests for the Compassion Campaign.

Gillette has since moved its testing operation to an undisclosed independent laboratory, where it pays outside contractors to blind and poison animals with its products.

Magram told the Herald that these tests are not required by any law and they offer no protection to you, the consumer, Companies who perform product testing on animals are doing so to protect themselves in the event of a consumer lawsuit.

What can you do to help? Write Gillette's Chief Executive Officer, Colman Mockler, at The Gillette Company, Prudential Tower Building, Boston, MA 02199 and tell him whether you plan to buy Gillette products in the future. Return Gillette products and demand a refund. Since this case was publicized, Gillette has changed its policy to require "product performance dissatisfaction."

Compassionate consumers are telling Gillette that after hearing of its abuse of animals, they reevaluated the product's performance and found it unsatisfactory. Get involved in Meredith's SETA, chaired by Catherine Shaw. Check the label of the products you buy before making a purchase.
