The Department of Math and Computer Science would like to extend an invitation to all freshmen and sophomores to take part in the Eleventh Annual Freshman-Sophomore Mathematics Contest. This exciting, yet challenging contest will be held on January 11, 1992. The contest consists of a test that participants will take which covers a wide variety of mathematical areas. The only specific content that will be assumed is that of Mat 211, yet an excellent student could be successful without any knowledge of Calculus.

The only eligibility requirement for the 11th annual competition is that students can have no more than 66 hours at the end of the fall semester of 1991. Prizes for the contest include a \$200 first prize scholarship and a \$100 second prize scholarship. Last year's winners include Stephanie Hopkins as the first place recipient and Mary Dana Morrill as the second place prize winner.
