The recent beautiful weather has enticed many golfers to practice their game and enjoy the sunshine. This holds true at Meredith as well.

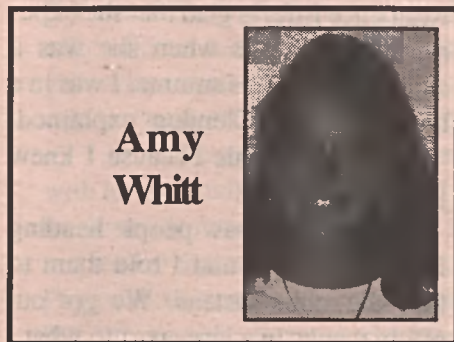
Meredith's golf team, coached by Bill Grady, has been practicing 3-4 times a week in preparation for the upcoming season.

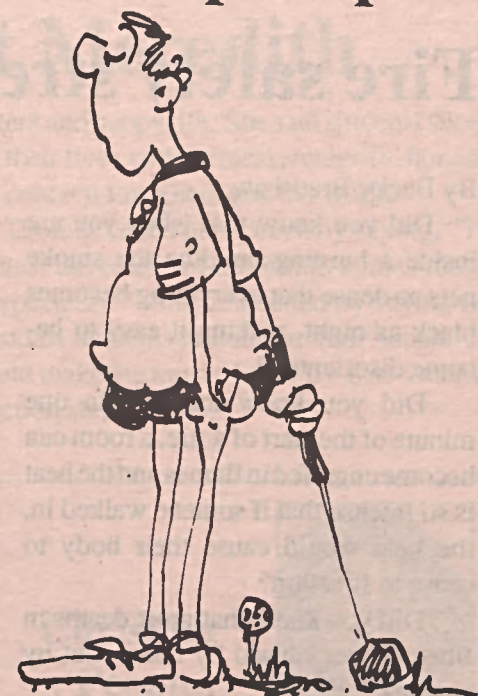
The fall season consists of three tournaments, the first of which is Sept. 18-20 in Farmville, Va. Next,
