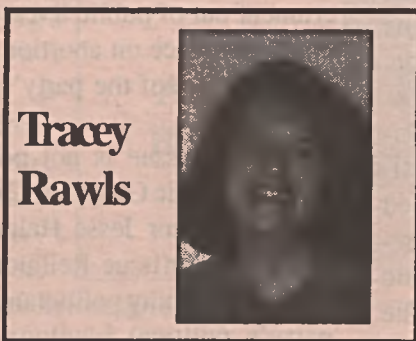


Meredith College wakes up with Bob and Mike

Eleanor F. Nunn was hired to join the Meredith community as a counselor and advisor to African American students. Nunn's career is complemented by her background.

Nunn volunteered her time and knowledge by joining the Peace Corps. She was stationed in Samaru, Nigeria. While there, Nunn helped to develop and coordinate science curriculum, and she also taught biology, chemistry, and agronomy.

Nunn has throughoutly enjoyed her career in teaching; however, she was able not only to gain experience from teaching, but also from working with the system.

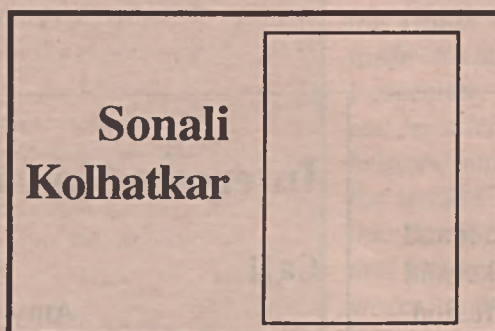
Nunn was a budget analyst for North Carolina, monitoring the operations at most of the UNC system.

She also worked in the private sector as a full partner in Endar Financial Services. She sold stocks and bonds. Nunn later became a consultant for the NC Institute of Minority Development. She was the liason between the NC Biotechnology Center and NC's Historically Black Universities(HBCU); she provided

information and technical support in biotechnology to HBCU.

Nunn's experience and knowledge will be an integral part of the Meredith community. According to Dorothy Sizemore, Dean of Students, Nunn has both knowledge of the classroom environment and the "behind the scenes work."

Dean Sizemore added that Nunn's background and training will bring new ideas to students and that her enthusiasm will be contagious.
