restored is the "passive losses," a plan that allows commercial real-estate operators to write off their rental losses. The industry is thankful for Bush's putting this into play.

One plan that the Democrats keep forgetting to initiate is the fact that no company executives and Congress should enjoy such high salaries and bonuses, yet Clinton and Congress have never touched this issue. Bush hopes to cut the pay of federal officials who make more than \$75,000 annually by 5%. He feels if "Americans have tightened their belts, so should better-paid federal workers." The housing industry is the core of society; consequently, if the industry begins to boom, then the positive effects will spread into other regions of the economy. As Bush has stated, "I want to stimulate entrepreneurial capitalism, not punish it."
