

SGA forum addresses student concerns

On Thursday, Oct. 1, Student Government Association held its first SGA Forum of the 1992-93 school year. Several questions were raised regarding security, senior parking, the cafeteria, gymnasium, and LeGreenhouse. Some of the concerns, along with their responses, are listed below:

1) It was brought up that many seniors are parking in non-parking spaces in the lot behind Poteat because they don't want to walk from spaces behind Stringfield or out towards Ridge Road.

Karen Howell reported that the "pit" next to the big parking lot for sophomores and juniors will be converted to senior parking only. Mr. Charles Tay-

lor, Vice President for Business and Finance has said that **this change will go into effect immediately following Fall Break.** Also, a blue light will be placed in this lot when money becomes available.

2) Another concern was raised over the cafeteria. Where are all of the new things we were promised?

According to Thad O'Briant, Dining Services Manager, all of the new equipment is here. However, the dining hall is not equipped with the electrical wiring necessary for their use. Everything should be in place by the time students return from Christmas

break. Also, the suggestion box is ready, they just have to find a good location for it.

3) A third issue discussed was extended hours in LeGreenhouse. Are they going to try extending the hours again like they did last year?

O'Briant claims that he needs to hear from the students that there is a demand for this because last year, the amount of business after regular hours did not pay for the cost of keeping it open.

SGA would like to thank all of the students, administrators, and staff who showed up to voice their concerns at the forum. Responses to the other concerns addressed will be printed in the *Herald* as they become available.
