Camcard introduced to Meredith

Last year the freshmen received new computer-made Meredith identification cards. This year these Camcards are serving us in many other capacities.

In the dining hall, resident students must use their cards as identification to get their meals. Commuters can take advantage of discounted meals in Belk Dining Hall.

The Meredith Supply Store allows students to purchase books, school supplies and Meredith paraphernalia. The transactions are quicker and easier than cash and check shopping.

Camcards can also be used in vending machines, photocopiers and for Cam-Tel payments. In the future, the cards will used for laundry machines, book check out in Campbell Library, voter registration in student elections and access to restricted areas.

A Secure Spending account is available through the Cam-Tel office. A student can deposit any amount and it will remain in their account until spent. If a student graduates or withdraws from school the balance goes to her student account and credit will be returned to the student.

If a card is lost or stolen the student's account will be kept on hold by notifying the Camcard office.

Students do not have to deposit money in a Secure Spending account; however, all students must have their Camcards activated for identification purposes.
