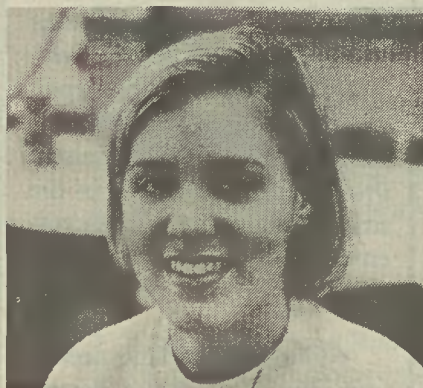


Question of the Week:

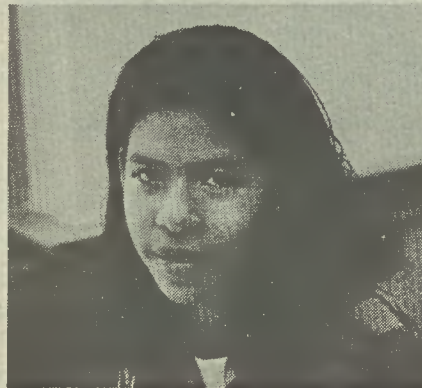
