Paula believes that students are of-


ten frustrated with housing because of male visitation, the unavailability of private rooms, and the choice of which dorm students are housed.


Even though they do work on campus, they rarely get to see each other. The only time they might run into each other is during lunch. Thad says that he is sometimes so busy he cannot even see her then.
