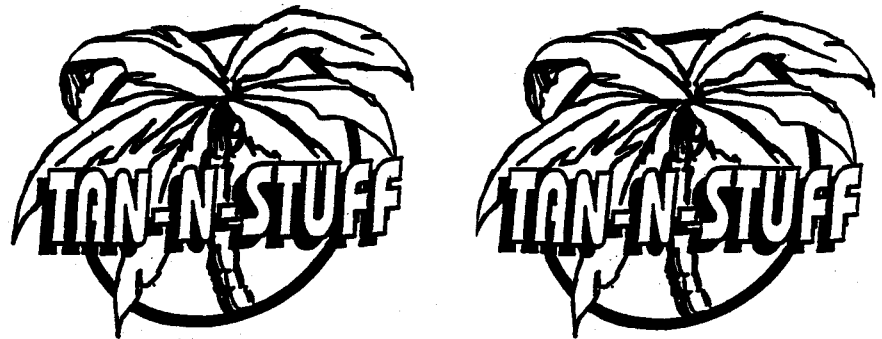
Editorial Policy:
