pay for each student's dry cleaning bills if they are under the deductible amount of the student's homeowner's insurance.

However, if the cost is over the deductible, then the student is asked to file a claim with their insurance company. Taylor says that they are trying to work with as few of claims as possible.

"Our goal is for the individual students not to incur any out of pocket costs," says Taylor.

With losses over the deductible amount, all students are definitely asked to file a claim. A handful of checks have been sent to parents for the cleaning bills, and everyday clothes are returned to the students.

The Residence Life office requests any students who have an extra space in their rooms to let the office know. These names will be used if for some reason a Heilman resident needs to be moved out her room assignment.

"This is a flexible time and we need to all pull together. Everyone needs to feel welcome around campus," says O'Briant.

According to the National Electrical Safety Foundation, the misuse of electricity, like using an extension cord as permanent wiring, can lead to fires, electrocutions and other serious electrical accidents. Many of these accidents can be prevented by a few simple safety precautions. The NESF offers electrical tips for a safer college year no matter where you're living.

- Use extension cords only on a temporary basis, not as permanent wiring.
- Don't run electric cords under rugs or carpets. The cords can overheat and cause a fire.
- Don't overload outlets. Doing so can blow a fuse, trip a circuit breaker or cause a fire.
- Purchase approved surge suppressers for your computer and entertainment systems. They
 help protect your electronics from voltage surges.
- Never force a plug into an outlet if it doesn't fit. Never cut a third prong.
- Don't use appliances that have frayed, cut or damaged cords. They could cause shock or fire
- Water and electricity don't mix. Don't place electrical appliances near water.
- Be alert when using electrical products. Read and follow manufacturer's use and care instructions.
