### Campus car thieves caught

Three men charged with car-breakings on Meredith's campus were apprehended and arrested by campus security and the Raleigh police Friday morning.

Meredith security chief Mike Hoke detained one white male and two black males at 10:15 a.m. on reasonable suspicion of involvement in three thefts which took place earlier last week. Hoke had seen the men driving around in the Pit parking lot in a red Nissan.

Upon conducting a "plain view" search of the Nissan, Hoke saw two long-blade screwdrivers, two cellular phones and three cases of cassette tapes. Three officers from the Raleigh Police Department arrived at Meredith upon request of campus security and arrested the three males.

The first car break-in occurred Monday, January 13 around 12 p.m. A student's cellular phone and purse were stolen from her car; the phone was retrieved from the Nissan Friday. Two thefts occurred Thursday, January 16, and the thieves took CDs and tried to take CD player. The thieves broke car windows to get the merchandise in all three cases.

"Put your stuff in the trunk of your car," said Hoke. "If you don't have a trunk, take it with you. Don't leave it in plain view."

## BeeHive eatery to open in two weeks

When the Bee Hive holds its grand opening, shoppers may be amazed at how much food has been packed on its shelves. Pending final inspections, Meredith's relocated and revamped snack bar will open January 30, to offer all the Hillsborough Street favorites on one convenient location, including a GrilleWorks, a Chick-fil-A, a Deli Corner, and an Itza Pizza.

GrilleWorks will serve hamburgers as well as garden burgers. Chick-fil-A, which added \$25 of "Chick-fil-A Bucks" to resident students' CamCards, will serve the traditional Chick-fil-A fare: fried and grilled chicken sandwiches, fried chicken strips, waffle fries, and their lemonade. Those looking for more health-conscious foods can find Healthy Choice meats and Alpine cheeses in the deli. Itza Pizza will let students build their own six-inch pizzas.

Aside from the hot food services, students may pick from a fruit and vegetable salad bar, a Freshen's frozen yogurt bar, a bakery box featuring bagels, muffins, cinnamon buns, muffins, Otis Spunkmeyer cookies and Krispy Kreme doughnuts, three gourmet coffees and a selection of teas, and shelves of the requisite snacks, candy bars, chips, and sodas.

Sharon Stingley, the Bee Hive's queen bee, admitted the range of provisions was ambitious, but said all services "should fly." Stingley, who worked for Meredith's catering for five years before her current position, said she welcomed an opportunity to "serve the Meredith community in a new way, but still see the same old faces." Stingley promised to put her "own little fingerprint on this operation and how it's done."

Stingley also said she would keep the Bee Hive "customer-conscious," by posting a sug-

gestion box and paying attention to repeat suggestions. "I'm very optimistic about the business I'm going to do," she said, pointing out that the Bee Hive's "self-serve" setup should keep customer traffic flowing and minimize any possible waiting. As Stingley said, "the sky is the limit" for the Bee Hive's future.
