David gets accepted to the Royal College of Music in London, and the father, who loves his son fiercely but is too selfish to see him succeed, gives him a choice between his family and the blissful escape he finds in music. As David moves to London and devotes his life to his music, we see the eccentric, erratic, quirky personality of a genius unfold. Music is his passion, his sole purpose for living and when he experiences a severe seizure after a competition, he is banned from playing because the doctors say it could kill him. His unconventionality escalates into insanity without his lifeline and he moves back to Australia where, after many years of struggling and wandering, he gets back his life and his music when he falls in love with a woman — finally someone to love him in return.

The problem is that one can't sum this movie in one paragraph. Those are the bare bones, but there are volumes more to *Shine*. The acting is monumental on all counts and the music is inconceivably moving. The passions, the inspirations and joys that triumph over the sadness and abuse in Helfgott's life are expressed beautifully and completely through the emotional complexity in selections from Chopin, Rachmaninoff, and Mozart (just to name a few). There are hand-doubles for the actors who play the younger David, but Geoffrey Rush, as the older David, plays the piano himself. He gives a commanding performance of the slightly detached genius and is my pick for this year's Best Actor award (for which he is nominated also).

Music does wonders for the soul. It speaks to that in all of us which appreciates and longs for beauty and harmony. *Shine* will fill that void and leave you speechless and inspired.
