
Department of Mathematics and Computer Sciences

Two of the Triangle's hottest modern dance choreographers will have their latest choreographic works performed by the Meredith Dance Theatre April 3,4, and 5 at 8 pm in Jones Auditorium

David Beadle, a relative newcomer to the North Carolina dance scene and to Meredith College's faculty, will premiere Indra's Web, a quarter set to the music of Claude Debussy. Using a unique and unusual movement vocabulary developed in collaboration with the dancers, this piece moves through many strong and fluid forms - revealing a subtle and sensitive universe where each individual action ripples through the whole.

Longtime Chapel Hill resident and former Pilobolus dancer Jack Arnold has been a visiting guest artist with the Meredith dance program this semester. Arnold has created a quizzical, comical, tongue-in-cheek look at life in a single-sex, church affiliated institution of higher learning. Hail Marys features six women in plaid field hockey kilts and a music collage which includes Franz Schubert's Gloria, My Baby Just Cares for Me performed by Nina Simone, and Leontyne Price singing Ave Maria.

Also on the program is the delightful We Left Our Fabulous Plaid Suits At Home, choreographed by acclaimed dancer Amy Chavasse; Alyson Colwell-Waber's lyrical ensemble work Weaving The Cloth; and the sculptural and evocative duct The Harding, created by MDT performers Kendra Edge and Allison Waddell.
