## Tennis team plays tournament in Bermuda

Over spring break, Meredith's tennis team participated in their first out-of-country sports program. The Spring Break Sports Program, which took place in Bermuda, brought together a variety of athletes and teams from across the country. Athletic teams included tennis, soccer, field hockey and golf teams.

While in Bermuda, the Meredith tennis team was matched with three northern teams — the University of Rochester, Pace University (both from New York), and Case Western University in Ohio.

The purpose of the trip, according to Coach Melinda Campbell, "was more or less to toughen the team up a bit." "It gave us a chance to play teams we hadn't seen before," she said. "It helped us become more match-tough."

Meredith beat Case Western University 8-1 and lost 3-6 to the University of Rochester and 1-8 to Pace University. Campbell felt the team did well and is proud of the team as a

whole. Playing teams they had never met before helped make the team more aggressive, according to Campbell. "I am proud of all our efforts," she said.

Junior co-captain Holly Tharpe said, "The trip was a good experience for us. It was good to face some new teams in order to assess our own abilities as a team."

Campbell said that the Spring Break Sports Program was helpful in preparing the team for the southeastern regionals, a tournament in which only 8 teams were invited.

While in Bermuda, the team had hoped to do a variety of activities, including a boat trip which had been planned. But because of windy and cold weather conditions, the team spent a lot of time on the bus, sightseeing. On the bright side, Campbell said, "we learned to play in windy conditions!"

Campbell said she is pleased with the team this year. She is especially pleased with the leadership of the junior class.

Campbell said, "There is a real legacy being set forth for players to follow."

## Aqua Angels astound audiences

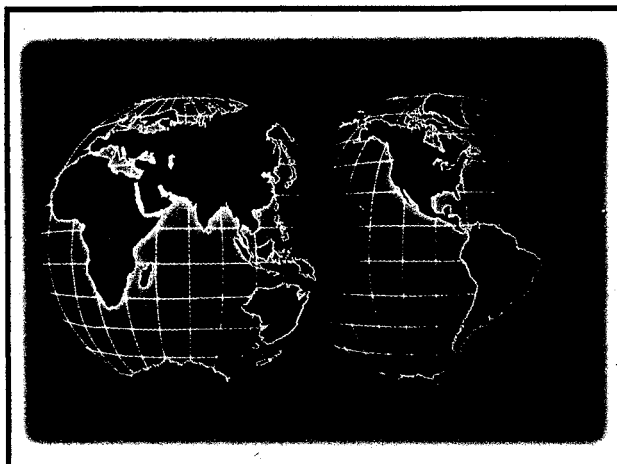

The Aqua Angels' performances brought wave after wave of spontaneous applause during their spring program, "Travel Through International Waters." Most impressive was an astonishing lift of Angel Sherrie Anders to close the "Red, White, and Blue" segment, and a Ferris-wheel-like roll featured in the presentations of France and England that kept their swimmers underwater for amazing periods of time. Special guest and Synchronized Swimming Hall of Famer Pam Wingerter's flawless pre-finale solo also earned extended applause.

When asked how a solo could be synchronized, Angel Betty-Shannon Poates explained the solo swimmer "synchronizes with the music," as Wingerter did with her selection, Ferrante and Teicher's "Summer of '42," and as Anders did for her indi-

vidual presentation of what the evening's narrator referred to as "the wonderful country of Africa."

Pointing to this line, a member of the audience who wished to remain anonymous said, "Africa's not a country. It's a continent." She also noticed



the areas picked for traveling were "a little anglo-centric," as the U.S., France, Scotland, and England got their own performances, while the countries of the "Orient," Africa, and South America each were lumped by region or land mass (although Jamaica did

receive individual treatment).

Upon further investigation, some musical selections failed to represent their respective regions. "Africa" was performed in part to the orchestral version of Englishman Elton John's "Circle of Life" (arranged by an American),

and Americans The Tokens' "The Lion Sleeps Tonight." "South America" found swimmers performing to music from non-Argentine Andrew Lloyd Webber's "Evita." "Scotland"'s selections were from the American feature film *Braveheart*, composed by James Horner. Most of the rest of the sources, to include the "Orient," Jamaica, and France,

were more closely connected with their assigned regions.

Special mention is due the evening's sound and lighting coordinator, Clay Adams, who lent excellent support to the Aqua Angels and produced a slick entertainment experience.
