If you answered yes to any of these questions, then you should run for a campuswide or class office in the 1997 Freshman Elections! Below are some tips for running in a Meredith

CHOOSE AN OFFICE

Check out the offices on pages 120-122 of your 1997-1998 Student Handbook and Activities Calendar. There are 22 offices for which you can run!
Find an Elections Board Notebook and look at the job descriptions listed for each

office. The notebooks are in the first floor pariors of every residence hall, in the Office of Student Activities, and at the Information Desk in Cate Center. Pay close attention to the skills needed and the time required for each position.

Talk to the woman who currently holds the position in which you are interested. Don't hesitate to ask her questions about the responsibilities that come with that office!
