Golf classic brings money for scholarships

Cries of "fore," whispers and cheers heralded the First Annual Angels Golf Classic. The event was held last Wednesday, Sept. 30 at Prestenwood Country Club and sponsored by the college's board of associates with proceeds benefiting Meredith's scholarship fund.

The board of associates has 50 members throughout North Carolina. They are friends and alumnae of Meredith that assist in events for fundraising.

Vice President of Institutional Advancement Murphy Osborn said, "They are the development arm of Meredith College."

The Angels Golf Classic was a project of the board of associates. Richard Newton, co-chair of the golf committee for the

associates, said he is extremely pleased with the success of the project and "is pleased to serve Meredith in this matter."

The board of associates already has a sponsor to have a second Angels Golf Classic and plans to carry it out next year. Kistler said that he and his teammates look forward to defending their titles.
