"I am reasonably sure that the man people are seeing is a

new male staff member that they don't recognize,' Hoke said. But, he noted, "I'm being very cautious."

He has sent Greene's profile and updated picture to all faculty and staff so that they can recognize him.

Office thieves "thrive on the inherent openness of colleges and churches," he said. Therefore Hoke

stresses that it is important for students to notify campus police immediately if they see a suspicious person on campus. When a sighting is reported, the police can go to the last place the person has been seen.
