Class of 2003 honored at next convocation

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Meredith College's class of 2003 will be honored at a special convocation on Monday, Sept. 13, 1999, at 10 a.m. in Jones Auditorium.

The convocation will focus on the first-ever Freshmen Summer Reading Program, coordinated by the Office of the First Year Experience and the 1999 Summer Reading Program Committee. During the summer, all incoming traditional aged freshmen were asked to read *Having Our Say*, the story of sisters Sarah and Elizabeth Delany, and to be prepared to discuss the book upon their arrival on campus this fall.

On Sept. 13, the freshmen will march into Jones Auditorium together and will discuss the "statements people make with their lives," using the Delany sisters and Meredith alumnae as examples.

Four Meredith faculty members will also speak.
