ceiling tiles. Tuesday and Wednesday, the crews cleaned the air ducts on second and third floors to get rid of the smoky odor that lingers in the rooms of many residents.

"They've learned how to do things with chemicals and cleansing fluids," said Strick-

Those students who live on the first floor will have the rest of the week to move their belongings, and Gleason stressed that all students would receive new room assignments, adding that every effort would be made to keep roommates and suite mates together.
