ceiling tiles. Tuesday and Wednesday, the crews cleaned the air ducts on second and third floors to get rid of the smoky odor that lingers in the rooms of many residents.

"They've learned how to do things with chemicals and cleansing fluids," said Strickland.

Those students who live on the first floor will have the rest of the week to move their belongings, and Gleason stressed that all students would receive new room assignments, adding that every effort would be made to keep roommates and suite mates together.

"We're consolidating some students that have vacancies," she said.

All first-floor residents were invited to a pizza party on Tuesday evening. At this party, they were informed about their room assignments. In addition, it was a time for them to reconnect with others on their hall.

"We know this will be difficult," said Gleason. "We're asking all resident students to work together."

Aheron said that students were "surprisingly calm" but that they are now "coming to terms with what happened." She added that first-floor resi-

dents have been "cooperative and understanding."

Aheron also said that the administration has been very helpful during the ordeal.

Facilities services plans to provide boxes and tape for students who have to move. Strickland noted that everyone on campus is "extremely proud" that all Heilman residents got out of the building in a timely manner. "That's what those fire drills are all about," he said.

Gleason added, "This will be a real opportunity for Meredith students to assist and support one another."
