

Meredith races to find cure for breast cancer

Last June, Meredith College hosted the state's largest 5K road race. And it was all for a good cause.

This year, Meredith will again host the Komen North Carolina Triangle

Race for the Cure to raise money for breast cancer research, education, screening, and treatment.

Three-fourths of the money raised will stay in the Triangle area for breast health

care and education programs. The remaining money will support the Komen Foundation's National Grant Program.

Over 12,000 runners are expected to show up on the morning of June 9. Participants have the option of running or walking the course.
