

Model United Nations team competes in Atlanta

Meredith's Model United Nations team traveled to Atlanta Nov. 21-24 to compete with other schools from the South at the Thirteenth Annual Southern Regional Model United Nations Conference. Forty-one schools participated including Berry College, Pace University, UNC- Asheville, UNC-Chapel Hill, UNC-

Greensboro, the University of Alabama, and the University of Tennessee. Overall, this year's conference was the largest in SRMUN history, with over 540 delegates attending. Model United Nations is an organization created by the United Nations to promote knowledge and support of the UN. Schools with Model UN teams or classes can attend regional and national conventions throughout the year. Each

school is assigned a country to represent in each committee of the UN. Schools who stay in the character of their country, present their ideas most effectively, and contribute meaningfully to the resolutions adopted by each committee of the Model UN are recognized at the end of the convention with an Honorable Mention, Outstanding Delegation Award, or a Distinguished Delegation Award.

Meredith's Model UN team represented Colombia and the Czech Republic at the conference. Michelle Kehoe, a first time delegate to MUN, and Sakeena Abdulraheem, returning for her second MUN conference, represented the General Assembly First Committee.
