Psi Chi to Host Holocaust Researcher at Spring Colloquium

Jerome Rosenberg, Ph.D., Associate Professor in the Department of Psychology and the New College Program at the University of Alabama will speak at the annual Spring Colloquium in Psychology tomorrow at 4 p.m. in 101 Ledford. The Colloquium is hosted by Meredith's Chapter of Psi Chi, the national honorary society in psychology.

Rosenberg's teaching and research interests include the Holocaust and other examples of Massive Human Destructiveness, Human and Humane Survival, Ethics and Social Issues, Prejudice and Social Movements and Interdisciplinary Models of Teaching.

At the Colloquium tomorrow afternoon, Rosenberg will discuss how he became involved in Holocaust research. He will talk with students about his various trips to concentration camps and his work with Holocaust survivors and on Holocaust survivors and con memorations.

The presentation will feature the early role of psychologists in Holocaust research and the current efforts in understanding genocide, perpetrators and generational aspects of Holocaust survival and trauma. In addition, his presentation will touch on the role of prejudice in the Holocaust and all genocides. Finally, Rosenberg will provide suggestions for future involvement for psychologists in Holocaust research.

He is a charter member of the Association of Genocide Scholars. He has served as Chair of the Alabama Holocaust Advisory Council and is currently a member of the Alabama Holocaust Commission.

Rosenberg has worked with Holocaust survivors, and he has served on the Hospice of West Alabama Ethical Review Board. Rosenberg currently teaches in the University of Alabama Thanatology Certificate Program and serves on its planning board. He has published on the issues of dehumanization and the Holocaust.

Rosenberg received his doctorate from Florida State University in Clinical Psychology.
