Students who are interested in applying to be an RA for the 2006 - 2007 academic year should talk with their current RA and/or Residence Director. Applications and information will be available

in mid-January, but it's never too soon to start learning about the position and the application process. There are a few requirements to be aware of before applying. Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 2.5 at the time of application and throughout the position and should have lived on campus at least one semester before applying. Other leadership experience is preferred but not required.
