Meredith College, Raleigh, N.C. — North Carolina Lieutenant Governor Beverly Perdue will speak at Meredith College's spring commencement on Sunday, May 14. Exercises will begin at 10 a.m. in McIver Amphitheater.

A former public school teacher and former director of geriatrics at a community hospital Perdue was elected North Carolina's Lieutenant Governor in 2000. Lieutenant Governor Perdue serves as President of the North Carolina Senate. She also serves on numerous key state boards that help shape state policies in economic development, health care,

education, rural development, technology and other governmental affairs. as one of the most effective members of the General Assembly.

Prior to her election as Lieutenant Governor, Perdue served in the North Carolina House of Representatives for two terms and the North Carolina Senate for five terms. She was consistently ranked Perdue holds a Bachelor of Arts from the University of Kentucky and earned master's and doctoral degrees from the University of Florida.

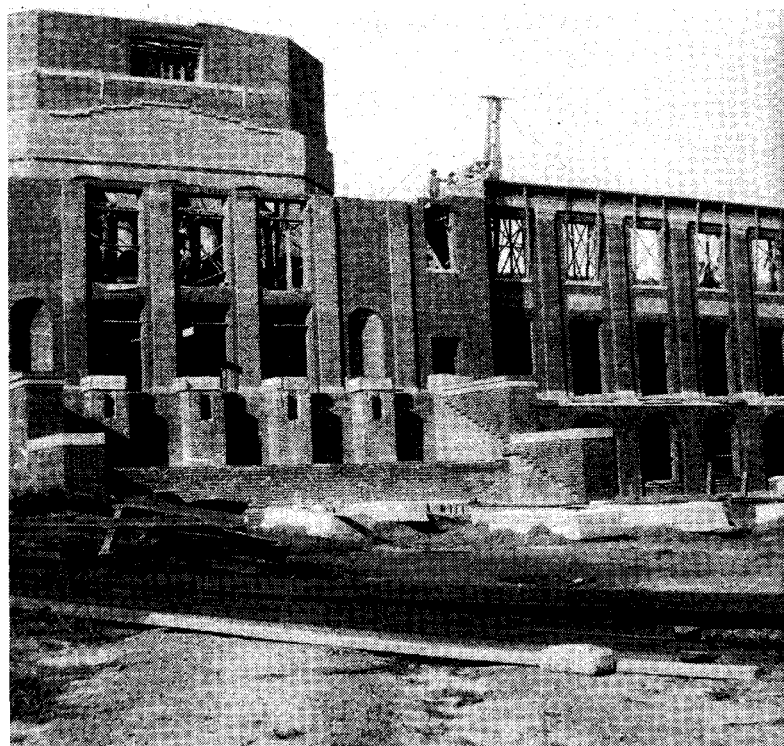
Features include:

□ "Film Clips," where you can watch short movies shot on campus in the 1930s and 1940

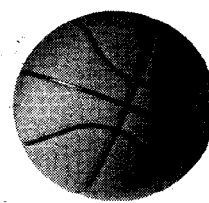
□ "Year-by-Year Doll Listing." Click on any class doll to enlarge it, zoom in and out, and rotate 360 degrees.
