First of all, what is a convocation? Is it a graduation ceremony? A religious event? According to Kincheloe, a convocation is simply a prestigious event on campus where the entire Meredith campus is invited to hear a respected speaker or performer. Some of the events may be geared towards the arts while others may focus on the environment or politics. The events change from year to year, and Kincheloe, along with the Convocation Committee; tries to select speakers and events that touch many different disciplines across campus and, therefore, reach out to the most people.
