A few weeks ago a young man over at North Carolina State University had a promising future until one night, right after school started, he and some of his buddies went out to celebrate his 21st birthday with a few drinks. The young man was completely smashed after a few drinks, and his buddies drove him back to his apartment where he slept for the night.

When he got up the next morning, he thought he was sober enough to get in his car and drive to class; apparently he was not as sober as he thought because his blood alcohol level was still over the legal limit. He was driving at high speeds and tragically killed a former NC State professor's wife. In a matter of moments, his life was changed forever because he faces criminal charges, and he now has to go around to high schools in the area and tell his story as part of his punishment.

Unfortunately, that young man is not the first and will not be the last not only to ruin his own life but also
