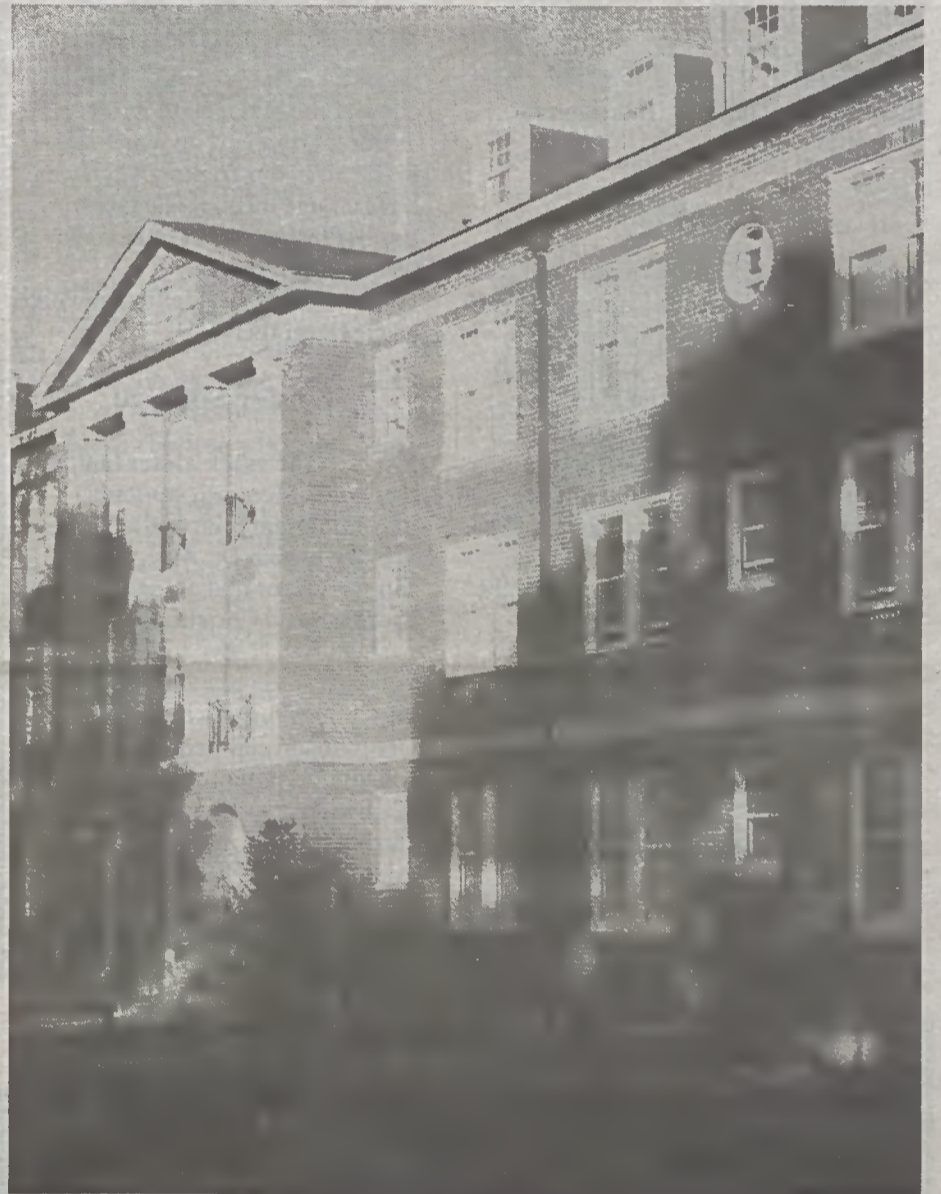
Theatre
